

- **What is the content of the course?**

The course has been designed to enable clients to explore why they have exceeded the speed limit and develop a personal speed awareness strategy. At the end of the course, clients should be able to:

1. Examine why limits are needed and recognise limits.
2. Understand that a speed below the posted limit is frequently appropriate.
3. Identify what causes them to speed.
4. Identify the disadvantages of speeding.
5. Identify the consequences of misusing speed.
6. Recognise different speed limit areas.
7. Demonstrate knowledge of appropriate use of speed.
8. Develop their personal Speed Awareness Strategy.

- **Where will the Course be held?**

The course will take place at an approved County Council venue.

- **Is the workshop transferable to my local area?**

- **When are courses run and how long will the course last?**

The course is theory based and lasts for three hours. Courses are run twice a day, Monday to Friday, the times are as follows:

You will need to arrive 15 minutes prior to the start time for refreshments and registration.

Payment must accompany the Speed Awareness booking form.

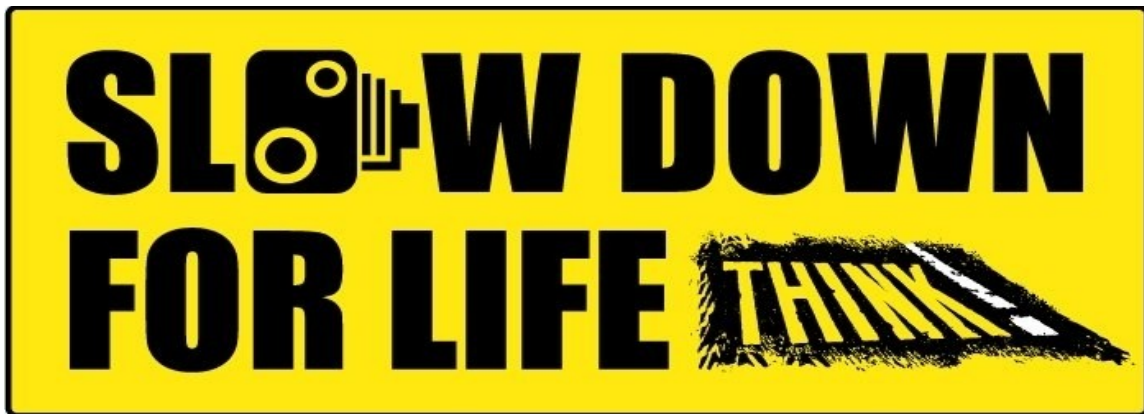
- **How do I pay for the course?**
